Group focuses on affordable housing for town

FALLS VILLAGE — The town should pursue ways to encourage affordable housing, according to those attending Monday's focus group that is one of a series on possible changes to the town's Plan of Conservation and Development.

Planner Jocelyn Ayer, who is working on the project with the Planning and Zoning Commission, led the meeting in discussing strategies for creating both rental and homeownership housing options.

The commission's recent townwide survey found housing to be high on the list of residents' concerns.

Ayer said the survey, which was answered by 174 of the town's 625 households, showed respondents are interested in finding ways to keep young people in town and that they see a lack of affordable housing for young adults and seniors.



